- Note 3:- Clerks employed at Jails (other than those employed on the accounts side) who are required by their Superintendents in the interest of public service to reside in the quarters provided by Government in the Jail premises, are exempt from payment of rent.
- Note 4:4 An Accounts Clerk appointed to officiate as Accountant in short vacancies not exceeding four months shall draw compensatory allowance, equal to the difference between his pay as Accountant and his pay plus house rent allowance as Accounts Clerk, the allowance being reduced by any amount by which his pay may be increased and ceasing as soon as his pay is increased by an amount equal to his compensatory allowance.
